## **CHECK ELIGIBILITY AND PROCEDURE**

You must be born in 1988 or later and enrolled in a graduate or postgraduate level study programme (Master level or higher) in any field of study at a regular university as of 1 February 2018.

Register now at **symp.sg/apply** and submit your essay no later than **1 February 2018**. All essays will be judged by an independent jury composed of academics and business executives. The 100 best competitors get invited to the 48<sup>th</sup> St. Gallen Symposium. The three best competitiors win the prestigious Award, which celebrates its 30<sup>th</sup> competition since 1989.
