Since the late 1990s, each year over 70 students from around the world come to Switzerland to participate in a week-long intensive WTO negotiation exercise. The Model WTO is organized by a group of highly dedicated students from the University of St.Gallen. The event takes place in St.Gallen and Geneva and culminates with a grand finale at the World Trade Organization's headquarters.

Participants act as representatives of WTO Members who get the chance to participate in virtual negotiating committees. At the outset, the students have an opportunity to communicate with actual negotiators from the countries they represent and seek their input and advice. They work towards a final declaration on which they vote. Throughout the process, the students are assisted by experts from the WTO Secretariat.
