

### Objectives


- Help students to identify today's public policy challenges from global perspectives and to learn how to design solutions




Please prepare a proposal

### **Proposal evaluation criteria**

- how the applicant ties his/her academic interests with public policy issues
- how the applicant could make a good use of the participation in IFW for her/his future professional career development
- most importantly, how the proposal attracts attention and interest of professionals at the target organizations

### What follows next?

- Proposal submission deadline: 9:00am on Monday, October 28
- Interviews of short-listed candidates: Tuesday, October 29, if needed
- Nomination: Friday, November 1
- Orientation: Monday, November 11 or otherwise (TBC)
- Preparation (including a few team meetings) from mid-November to early February
- Scheduled departure: Sunday, February 9

## **Course grading**
