授業のキーワード Keywords	 The theme is "The Crisis of Globalization". This theme allows a number of readings. In the years following the 2008-2009 crash and particularly from 2016, numerous commentators have started to point to a crisis of globalization, which had been the trend since the 1990s. Multilateralism seems in retreat in many important areas, and so the role of International Organizations. On the other hand, the nation-state seems to have reaffirmed itself as the privileged <i>locus</i> of policy making. However, crises like the Covid-19 pandemic have stressed the point that the world needs coordination and governance from a supranational perspective, perhaps more than ever. The Challenge We invite students at all GPPN Schools to contribute to a discussion about the state of globalization is still possible? To the benefit of whom? Based on what ethical and political principles? We also would like students to think about concrete proposals for the advancement of regional and international cooperation, for the strengthening of global governance mechanisms and institutions, in specific areas as well as in the more general domain of international relations. 	 A clear awareness of whether and when similar solutions have been tried in the past, why they were successful or how they can be amended in order to be successful in the future.
