May 21 (Wednesday): Mid-term student presentation [‡]

‡: Each student is given 10 minutes for his/her oral presentation, followed by questions and answers. Unless you are a very experienced and skilled speaker, I would suggest preparing notes based on the mid-term report to help you keep on track. You should speak more slowly (about 100 words per minute) than in your ordinary conversation—logically, you cannot speak more than about 1,000 words within a given timeframe of 10 minutes. You might wish to use power point slides.

May 28 (Wednesday): Discussion on specific issues
