The McDonnell International Scholars Academy has a center of international scholastic activities at Washington University in St. Louis. Its core mission is to recruit scholars from our partner institutions throughout the world to pursue graduate and professional degree at Washington University. In addition, we encourage scholars to learn from and collaborate with our faculty in working on interdisciplinary projects.

The University of Tokyo, as a leading institution in Japan, is one of our partners in this program. Each year Scholars are selected from each partner university on the basis of their promise to become future leaders in academia, government, the profession, or the corporate world. The Academy will provide academic, cultural, and social opportunities to help Scholars develop into future leaders knowledgeable about important international challenges and global cultures.

Each Scholar accepted to the Academy will receive:

- full tuition for study in a graduate or professional degree program,
- a 12-month living stipend for each year that the Scholar is making satisfactory progress toward a degree (approx. \$26,000 in 2008)
- a one-time allowance of up to \$1,500 for travel to Saint Louis for a period of study as an Academy Scholar
- an annual travel allowance of up to \$2,000 for a trip back to the Scholar's alma mater.
