GraSPP is now inviting applications for Exchange and Double Degree Programs for Academic Year 2014-2015

At the Graduate School of Public Policy we are actively engaged in international exchange. It is in this spirit of cooperation that we implemented reciprocal exchange agreements with the School of International and Public Affairs (Columbia University) and the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy (National University of Singapore) in the autumn of 2006. In 2008 we signed agreements with the School of International and Pacific Studies (University of California, San Diego campus), Sciences Po (Paris), and the Hertie School of Governance (Berlin). We are also pleased to announce that the Graduate School of International Studies (Seoul National University) and the School of International Studies (Peking University) have joined our partnership of CAMPUS Asia Program is an educational collaboration between China, Korean and Japan. Also, as of October 2013, with Heidelberg University, GraSPP has recently concluded exchange agreement. Including the CAMPUS Asia Program universities, now we have total of eight partner universities. Students at both GraSPP and the partner schools can enjoy the opportunity to enroll in a diverse range of classes together whilst creating new friendships and experiencing each other's culture. Memorandums of double degrees were also concluded with LKY-SPP in 2009 and with SIPA in 2010, with Sciences Po. in 2011, with GSIS-SNU and HSoG in 2012, and with SIS-PKU in 2013. Under the double degree programs (henceforth DD) students can obtain degrees from both the University of Tokyo and the partner university upon satisfying the graduation requirements of both degrees. We will be accepting applications for exchange programs for academic year 2014 at all six schools, as well as DD programs at the four schools.
