Objective

The objective of this symposium is to provide, as we approach the creation of an ASEAN Economic Community scheduled for the end of 2015, a forum for exchanging views among researchers and practitioners from ASEAN countries and Japan on how we may identify and create a new paradigm for advanced-stage development in Asia. The focus is to explore ways to maximize human capital potential as well as to enhance institutional capacity which underlines path towards such a development, and also to create a sustained and equitable society over the long term. In our joint discussions, the question of how the concept of “advanced-stage development in Asia” should be defined, operated and implemented will be of central importance.

A more recent initiative suggests that ASEAN countries already started to look beyond 2015 once the ASEAN Economic Community is in place. A longer term outlook is whether many ASEAN countries would be able to graduate from the middle-income stage and move towards a full status of developed countries and in what way ASEAN has definitely planned to use its AEC post 2015 to enhance such a development in addition to the existing domestic policy agenda. Questions abound and it is still important for each of ASEAN countries and as a whole to ponder closely this new paradigm.

On the other hand, Japan has always played a very constructive role in the ASEAN region right from the beginning up to now. No one can deny that Japan will continue to be an integral part of ASEAN's future development in a very meaningful way, but again in what way that role of Japan would continue to be in the years to come is still a big question. Fortunately, ASEAN and Japan had just celebrated their 40 years of close partnerships, so it is with big hope that this partnership will continue to be very productive and healthy as it always was.

The symposium is a joint academic service to society by Chula Global Network and the

Graduate School of Public Policy (GraSPP), The University of Tokyo, in collaboration with Faculty of Economics, Chulalongkorn University, to promote knowledge sharing among professionals including policy makers, academia and members of the business community, as well as with the general public. It also serves for the creation of networks between public, private and community entities, locally and internationally.
