

## Call for Student Essays for Fall 2015 Issue: The Geopolitics of Energy

The upcoming issue will explore the problems and solutions that energy strategies add to the geopolitical and environmental problems we face today.

The committee welcomes papers on any energy-related topic. Possible topics may include:

- Shale gas revolution's effect on US and major exporters to US
- Latin America's leap to renewable energy
- Energy and climate treaties
- Exploring the Arctic

Authors of accepted papers may be invited to present their work at the Thought Leadership Forum at Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs, Papers will be published in the Fall 2015 issue of the Journal of International Affairs alongside noted scholars and the winning authors of each contest will receive \$500 (USD).

## **Submission Guidelines:**

- Essays cannot have been previously published, but need not be written specifically for the contest. Papers submitted for academic credit are welcome, provided they are relevant to the upcoming issue's theme.
- Papers should not exceed 4,000 words.
- Citations should be in the form of footnotes formatted according to the Chicago Manual of Style 16th
