Dean's Message

Not only Japan but the whole world has suffered tremendously under the COVID-19 pandemic. During this time, other countries experienced several rounds of lockdowns, and in Japan, people were asked to refrain from going out unnecessarily and from enjoying leisure activities such as tourism and large-scale events. At the time of writing, there are no prospects for the end of the pandemic, but we can only hope that by the time you read this, we will have surely entered the post-COVID era.

Universities have also been hit with major challenges. Most classes have been taught online, and extracurricular activities have been greatly restricted. Important events such as entrance and graduation ceremonies had to be cancelled or scaled down. The Graduate School of Public Policy (GraSPP) was no exception.

As it happens, GraSPP had been working on digital transformation (DX) for some time, and I believe that because of this fact, we were able to respond to the crisis relatively smoothly. As this DX experience illustrates, the University of Tokyo's GraSPP has been willing to take on new challenges. I am proud to say that the fact that the school was established in 2004 and is quite new has had a positive impact. This is why we have been able to boldly take on new challenges without sticking to past traditions.

In 2010, an international program called MPP/IP was launched, where classes are held in English and the majority of students are international. As a result, there are now more international students than Japanese students at GraSPP as a whole.

In 2016, an English-based doctoral program was established. In this program, courses are taught in English, and students are required to write their doctoral dissertations in English. This is very rare for a graduate school in Japan. A number of students from the doctoral program are already making great contributions to society.

I think that the pandemic has made it clear how important public policy is and what a great impact it has on society and the economy. Far from decreasing, the importance of public policy schools, which train public policy professionals to take on such a heavy responsibility, will surely continue to increase.

Join us, and together we can take on the challenges for a new future.

Courses

Legal Policy Program

OBJECTIVE

This program provides students with the opportunity to study the theory and practice of law in public administration, and acquire advanced and practical skills. By analyzing socioeconomic issues from a legal perspective and gaining the knowledge and planning skills necessary to solve them, students acquire the ability to create and apply specific laws and regulations.

The curriculum is designed to help students understand the legal systems involved in various administrative fields and acquire the legislative skills necessary to draft laws and regulations. It is also designed to help students learn how to make balanced legal judgments in the administrative field through specific case studies.

Public Management Program

OBJECTIVE

This program helps students acquire the ability to analyze and plan issues related to public policy from the perspective of political science and public administration. Students also gain the knowledge necessary for organizational and policy management as well as business management skills, thereby helping them to acquire public management skills.

CURRICULUM

The curriculum is designed to develop students who can identify issues and construct appropriate measures through specific cases. Students learn to understand various theories and systems related to public management, construct a new public management system, and acquire the ability to manage them.

Courses

International Public Policy Program

OBJECTIVE

This program equips students with the knowledge, negotiation skills, planning skills, and communication methods to deal with international policy issues such as diplomacy and development aid. Students aim to acquire the ability to formulate policies on international issues such as global warming and security problems.

CURRICULUM

The curriculum is designed to teach students to understand regional issues and their political and economic context, as well as equip them with the skills to formulate measures to solve issues in an international context. Through case studies, students can also deepen their understanding of the context of a development, using specific international conflicts and other examples.

Economic Policy Program

OBJECTIVE

This program aims to foster competencies in the use of economic analysis in public policy. Students will acquire the knowledge and ability to analyze and evaluate primarily from an economic perspective.

The curriculum is structured with the intention of learning the basic of microeconomics and macroeconomics, acquiring the econometric and cost-benefit analysis methods necessary for quantitative evaluation, and developing applied skills through case studies.

Doctoral Program (International Public Policy)

Overview

Doctoral program (International Public Policy) fosters students based on three pillars.

- Advanced research skills and the ability to formulate original questions based on their research
- The ability to combine a variety of expertise to develop and evaluate solutions
- The ability to quickly implement such solutions from an international perspective, communicating with diverse stakeholders

Curriculum

The curriculum is made up primarily of applied research courses, practical research courses, and required research courses. Most of the courses are offered in English and can be completed in English only.

Applied research courses:

The foundation of the course is economics and law and politics. We also offer courses that interface with the sciences to ensure an interdisciplinary perspective.

Practical research courses: The courses are taught by faculty members who are also practitioners, with the aim of improving practical skills.

Required research courses:

Undertaken in conjunction with economics and politics faculties, the emphasis is on improving skills in defining issues creatively, and on the design and implementation of field-based research projects. Courses include a supervised doctoral thesis, with participation by a collaborating supervisor under the direction of a main supervisor.



Research Areas	The program focuses on the three areas where social demands are particularly strong and where there is a need for close international partnership.				
International Finance and Development	The program covers several key areas such as monetary policy, exchange rate pol- icy, fiscal policy, financial sector regulations and supervision, crisis prevention and recovery, economic development, inequality, trade and labor issues, and foreign investments. The program guides students to comprehend those policy issues and underlying causes, based primarily on the discipline of economics, with possible ap- plication of law and politics.				
International Security	Globalization has highlighted the need to address complex interconnected risks, from pandemics to global terrorism and cyber-attacks. Climate change and AI tech- nologies also invite greater involvement of science and technology in policy making and risk assessment. Taking an international and interdisciplinary perspective, this program examines security challenges primarily grounded in the disciplines of law and politics with possible application of economics.				
Science & Technology Policy	There are concerns that the continued digitalization of society, the spread of IoT, and other advances are not only changing the concept of competition that is the basis of the market economy and stimulating technological hegemonism by each country, but could also be shaking the very foundations of democracy. Moreover, the areas where science and technology and public policy intersect are becoming increasingly important in such fields as energy policy, healthcare policy, space poli- cy, maritime policy, and environmental policy. This research area fosters high-level science and technology policy doctoral stu- dents with interdisciplinary and practical international capabilities by covering such fields in conjunction with natural science departments, while still being based on economics, political science, and law.

Combining practical work with cutting-edge education and research is also the important mission of GraSPP. The research units' activities are reported on the GraSPP website, and research outcomes are widely disseminated to society through symposiums and seminars.

Transport and Tourism Policy Research Unit TTPU	TTPU conducts higher quality education and research activi- ties in the fields of transportation, which are expected to play an extremely important role in ensuring Japan's sustainable growth and affluent lives, and tourism, which is closely relat- ed to transportation.
Science Technology and Public Policy SciTePP	SciTePP addresses the nexus between science technology and public policy. Specialists from various fields such as political science, law, economics, and engineering come together to examine and structure issues, and to contribute to the discus- sion on policy selection in society.
Technology Transfer under Sustainable Economy TECUSE	TECUSE is researching policies to transfer and spread global warming countermeasures technologies in Asia and other developing countries, and to also maintain and boost Japan's industrial competitiveness.

Executive Programs

GraSPP offers three executive programs for professionals.

HTA Expert Program As part of the Health Policy and Technology Assessment Research Project, this program is aimed at working professionals and young researchers, etc., and seeks to nurture the next generation of health and technology assessment experts with advanced and practical abilities in health policy and assessment.

Innovation Governance Expert Program This program gives participants an opportunity to work practically on governance design conducive to implementing innovation in society. The program combines lectures on the latest trends in related fields such as law, management, philosophy, systems engineering, and risk management from some of the world's leading experts, and group projects where participants take up real-life cases and come up with their proposal on systems of governance that would suit the particular cases. This is a practical and experimental program that brings together participants from various backgrounds (private sector, public sector, and civil society) to engage in discussions oriented toward coalescing their diverse perspectives in search of holistic (as opposed to partial) optimization, thereby fostering ways of thinking conducive to implementing innovation and organizational reform in a sustainable manner.

Economic Security and Corporate Risk Management Executive Program This program is targeted mainly for executives in the private sector, aiming to provide knowledge necessary to respond to changes in the international situation and manage risk as a business decision.

The course will introduce a wide-range of up-to-date knowledge on international situations concerning economic security and risk management challenges in companies, and deepen participants' understanding of such issues through practical discussions based on their own hands-on experiences in management.



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
