H.E. Dr. Kao Kim Hourn: Born in Cambodia, Dr. Kao survived the Khmer Rouge genocide and moved to the U.S. at the age of 15. In 1993, he returned to Cambodia to run a think tank dedicated to ASEAN and international affairs. From 2001 to 2013, he served the Royal Government of Cambodia in a variety of capacities including Secretary of State of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation. He established the University of Cambodia in 2003, where he served as the President until 2022 before he assumed his current position in January 2023. He holds a Master of Arts in Political Science and International Relations from Ohio University, and a PhD in Political Science from the University of Hawaii at Manoa.
