GraSPP Policy Challenge 2023

Global Innovative Public Policy Solutions

Can you propose workable solutions to important public policy problems?

Can you apply your analytical skills to solve a policy issue?

Do you want to showcase your idea during an international conference?

Do you want to meet creative students from all around the world?

GraSPP Policy Challenge (GPC) offers a unique opportunity to students from diverse background to collaborate and seek to improve their teambuilding and policy-making skills. Participants are tasked with responding to pressing real-world policy challenges as a group, and with designing policies and proposals in response to those challenges.

All Master's students at GraSPP and/or STIG are strongly encouraged to apply. Finalist groups will be ultimately invited to present at the GPPN 2024 Annual Conference hosted by Sciences Po, Paris in February 2024.

➤ Theme

The theme for the 2024 GPPN Conference is: ***"Policy proposals to reduce the impact of climate change on vulnerable population and territory"***

Studies have shown that climate change has serious consequences on social aspects. We know that the most vulnerable populations are the first victims of it and that the climate crisis is responsible for worsening social inequalities. Regional inequalities, inequalities in access to resources and climate refugees are direct effects of climate change. How can public policies limit the impact of climate change on societies ? We are looking for creative solutions for policymakers and governments.

➤ The Challenge

The GPPN invites students to work on an important policy challenge in any field in line with the chosen theme. Proposals can incorporate public, private or hybrid approaches. Please note that a maximum of 3 "app proposals" will be selected.

We are looking for student presentations on public policy proposals that demonstrate:

- **Argumentation** : A precise identification and analysis of the targeted population or territory; this precise analysis of the problem will need to be clear prior to discussion of any possible solutions

- **Figures** : A strong use of analytics and empirics and how these can be applied to inform a solution to the public policy problem identified
- **Implementation** : An astute understanding of how policy solutions can be implemented given the interests of the policy actors in the chosen context
- **Benchmarking** : A clear awareness of when similar solutions have been tried in the past, why they were successful or amended in order to be successful in the future.

➤ **Criteria**

Proposals will be assessed against the following criteria, which are equally weighted. These are the same criteria as will be used at the conference:

- a) **Problem** : policy analysis and strength of design (i.e. if it is based on sound analytical principles) (25%),
- b) **Solution** : implementation concerns including awareness of stakeholder interests (25%), (relevance of the solution)
- c) **Implementation** : Mechanisms for learning, self-correction and refinement over time (25%), (setting up the proposal over time : the proposal must include different scenarios)
- d) **Presentation** : Quality of presentation (25%) (clarity, legibility, compliance with instructions)

➤ **Format**

Selected teams and proposals selected to participate in the GPPN Conference at Sciences Po will each give a presentation on the first day of the conference of up to 3 minutes.

Up to 10 teams/proposals will be given detailed feedback by the Jury of Deans and selected to present on the second day of the conference. This second presentation will be for up to 5 minutes followed by questions from the Jury.

Please note that attendance is mandatory during the 2 days of the Conference for all the students selected.

➤ **To apply:**

Students should form teams and work together to develop their proposals. Each member can participate in one team only. The group must consist of **2 to 4 Master's students who are currently enrolled in GraSPP and/or STIG** and apply via: <https://forms.gle/RZw6DBmA7AkYG7gY8> **by noon, 24 October**. You may also apply individually and leave GraSPP to find your teammates. The groups and advisors will be announced **by 27 October**.



➤ **Schedule (TBC)**

Noon, 24 October: Application deadline

27 October: Briefing Session (mandatory for all participants)

23 November: Submission of Research Proposals (Approx. 2,000 words)

6-12 December: A2 Course Registration

11-15 December (TBC): Presentation Screening - Selection of the GPPN 2024 Conference teams

28 January 2024: Deadline for final PPT slides and a policy proposal (Approx. 6,000 words)

Early February (TBC): Presentation Rehearsal (*GPPN 2024 Conference participants only)

22-23 February: GPPN 2024 Conference in Paris

➤ **Credits**

This project is conducted as Case Study "**GraSPP Policy Challenge – Global Innovative Public Policy Solutions**" (5140735) in A2. Those who complete all requirements will be able to earn 2 credits. (Grades: Pass/Fail)

Course registration is required separately to earn credits, which will be done by GraSPP Office, not via UTAS. Students willing to participate in the course must pre-register via online registration form. This course can be taken repeatedly and counted as up to 4 credits.

The School of Public Affairs of Sciences Po will host the 2024 international conference of the Global Public Policy Network (GPPN) on Thursday 22 February and Friday 23 February 2024. **Students selected to participate will have the opportunity to present their projects to the Deans of eight of the most prestigious schools of public affairs as well as network with students from all over the world.**

➤ **Financial Support:**

For participants of the 2024 GPPN Conference, a flat amount of JPY 150,000* will be subsidized as part of the travel expenses by GraSPP. (*It will be reimbursed only after your return upon submission of all required documents.)

Accommodation during the conference will be arranged by Sciences Po with details provided to participants closer to the time.

Note:

Students should be responsible for all expenses exceeded the above amount. Please ensure to have sufficient funding to self-pay all additional costs including meals, additional accommodation, visa, travel insurance and local transportation etc.
