Graduate School of Public Policy (GraSPP), The University of Tokyo

Important Notice

The current CAMPUS Asia Mode 3 program (funded by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology, Japan) will conclude at the end of March 2026. After a selection process lasting approximately seven to eight months, the program may transition to Mode 4 if approved. Details of GraSPP's Mode 4 initiatives have not yet been determined.

Regardless of the outcome of the new application, study abroad at partner universities (both Double Degree and Exchange) will remain possible under existing agreements. However, please note that program contents and financial support may be subject to change without prior notice. Applicants are advised to apply with a full understanding of these circumstances.

1. Eligibility

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- Students already enrolled in the Master of Public Policy, International Program (MPP/IP) at GraSPP, The University of Tokyo, entering in April or September 2025.
- Japanese nationals or Korean nationals holding special permanent resident status in Japan (students of other nationalities may consult the program office in advance*).
- Satisfy the TOEFL iBT score requirements indicated below (see Section 10 for details).

* As the CAMPUS Asia program is a trilateral exchange among Japan, China, and Korea, participation is particularly encouraged for Japanese nationals and Korean nationals with special permanent resident status in Japan. Students of Chinese nationality are not eligible for study at Peking University.

2. Available Study Options and Periods

1. Basic option: Double Degree (2 semesters) + Exchange (1 semester), or Exchange (1 semester) + Exchange (1 semester).
2. Students complete their first year of study at GraSPP, and go abroad in their second year or later. The total enrollment period at GraSPP, including time spent abroad, must be a minimum of 2 years and may not exceed 3 years.
3. Double Degree at Peking University is available only for October 2025 or entrants who extend their enrollment to three years. Application period is February 2026.
4. From Fall 2026, single-university options (DD only or EX only) may be available if spaces remain, as priority will be given to students applying for the standard program option.
5. Please note that students of Chinese nationality are not eligible for study at Peking University (DD or EX).
6. Concurrent applications to other study-abroad programs outside CAMPUS Asia are not permitted.

5. Selection Process

Screening will be based on document review and an interview conducted in English.

6. Internal Selection Schedule

Application Period: October 17 (Fri) – November 16 (Sun), 2025

Interview: Mid-November to December 3, 2025

Announcement of Results: Early to mid-December 2025 (tentative)

7. Important Notes

Applicants selected and recommended by GraSPP for the program will later be required to apply to the host university directly. Please prepare the following documents in advance, noting that application procedures may differ by academic year. Updated information will be provided to selected candidates once the host universities announce their calls for applications.

Documents typically required by partner universities:

- 1–2 Recommendation Letters (specific format required for SNU)
- Academic Transcripts (undergraduate and graduate, in English)
- Certificate of Highest Degree Attained (Bachelor's degree certificate, or certificate of enrollment in a graduate program, in English)
- Application Form (host university's prescribed format)
- Two ID photos, etc.

Final admission decisions rest with each host university.

8. Participation Requirements after Selection

Students selected through GraSPP's internal screening will participate in the CAMPUS Asia Program as CAMPUS Asia student. While enrolled at GraSPP, students are required to register for the following CAMPUS Asia joint courses (each worth 2 credits):

- 5140745 Case Study (CAMPUS Asia Joint Course: Public Policy in East Asia and Japan I)
- 5140746 Case Study (CAMPUS Asia Joint Course: Public Policy in East Asia and Japan II)

It is recommended to complete these courses prior to departure for study abroad; however, students may adjust the timing according to their enrollment and exchange schedules.

Features	Peking University is one of the first national key universities established in 1898 as a national university. As China's premier institution of higher learning, it has produced many politicians and scientists. It is also adjacent to Zhongguancun, China's Silicon Valley, where numerous IT industries and research centers are located. The School of International Studies accepts students with a solid foundation in their undergraduate major and a desire to actively study Chinese diplomacy and international relations. The "Master of International Relations" course, to which students studying abroad under the CAMPUS Asia program belong, is small, with a maximum of 20 students per academic year, and combines theory and practice, allowing students to learn in English about politics, diplomacy, and social development in modern China in depth. It is also possible to earn a master's degree from Peking University if you fulfill the requirements for earning the required credits, writing a research paper, and passing an oral examination.

The school train students for academic and practical careers in a wide range of fields, including bureaucracies, international organizations, research institutes, think tanks, multinational corporations, media, and universities. They also offer a special learning environment that sets it apart from other universities, with leading instructors in the fields of international trade, international cooperation, international relations studies, and Korean studies.
